

What will SOMS do for CDCR?

- Improve safety and security by providing immediate access to up-to-date offender data
- Reduce the time for certain offender management processes such as:
 - Reception processing
 - Scheduling and tracking rehabilitative programs
 - Inmate classification and disciplinary
 - Pre-release planning
 - Parole transition and parole supervision
 - Calculating release dates and discharge dates

More SOMS Benefits


- Provide immediate and flexible reporting capabilities
